Did you know that the USGS's North American Breeding Bird Survey (BBS) has a bit of a presidential history? Former President **JIMMY CARTER** and First Lady Rosalynn were avid birders who assisted in the BBS, one of the nation's most foundational sources for long-term, scientific bird population data.

The BBS is a cooperative effort between the USGS Eastern Ecological Science Center (EESC) and Environment Canada's Canadian Wildlife Service to monitor the status and trends of North American bird populations. The program was initiated in 1966 in response to prominent concerns at the time. In the mid-20th century, the use of post-war chemicals like DDT

(dichloro-diphenyl-trichloroethane) grew, as did concerns about their effects on wildlife. Local studies had attributed some bird kills to pesticides, but it was unclear how, or if, bird populations were being affected. Responding to this concern, a wildlife biologist named Chandler Robbins and his colleagues at the Patuxent Wildlife Research Center (now a campus of the EESC) created the BBS program to monitor bird populations over large geographic areas.

Each year during the height of the avian breeding season (June, for most of the U.S. and Canada), thousands of dedicated participants highly skilled in bird identification collect these important BBS data. These observers sample the BBS's thousands of pre-determined roadside routes by stopping at roughly half-mile intervals to perform bird counts. During each count, the observer records every bird they see or hear within a quarter-mile radius for exactly 3-minutes — no more or less — making it the perfect job for a conscientious, service-oriented birder.

On his experience with birding and the BBS, President **CARTER** remarked in an interview, "We don't like to just add a name to our list. We also like to learn something about each species' habits. After our trip to Tanzania, we discovered that one of the study trails for the annual U.S. Breeding Bird Survey is located near our home in Plains, Georgia. Ever since, we have joined the survey experts during the first week of June and we've learned a lot about the local species and their calls. Now, wherever we travel, we try to set aside time for bird-watching with an experienced local birder."

For five years between 1989 and 1996, Jimmy and Rosalynn **CARTER** participated in the Lacross BBS survey, located not far from their home in Plains, GA. They assisted BBS observer Mark Oberle.

The BBS archive of records at the EESC includes correspondence related to their participation, like mention of an anhinga found on the route for the first time during one of their surveys. In another year, Mark reflected on how he and the Carters felt their low Carolina Wren numbers were likely due to a March blizzard that had brought two inches of snow to Plains, GA. Their conclusion aligns with later findings from BBS data range-wide, showing that Carolina Wren populations decline following harsh winters.

At the **CARTER** Center in Atlanta Monday night, CEO Paige Alexander hosted Mary Robinson in a fireside chat to discuss a new documentary about the former president of Ireland's life and her tenure at the United Nations and The Elders, a group in which she and the late President **JIMMY CARTER** and other former heads of state petitioned world leaders for peace and justice. Robinson first met **CARTER** at the Trilateral Commission in 1973.

Mrs. Robinson explores the triumphs and pitfalls of leadership on the global stage and the importance of maintaining hope in the push for human rights and environmental initiatives.

Ahead of International Women's Day, the public film screening in the Center's Cecil B. Day Chapel was presented in part by the Consulate General of Ireland and preceded by a private reception hosted by Board Chair Jason **CARTER** with guests including Andrew Young and members of Archbishop Desmond Tutu's family. Young, of course, served as U.S. Ambassador to the UN in the **CARTER** White House years. Tutu, who died in 2021, was a key voice in South Africa's anti-apartheid movement, a member of The Elders and a friend of the Carters. Atlanta journalist and philanthropist Pat Mitchell, also in attendance, serves on the **CARTER** Center's board of councilors and is one of the film's executive producers.

The 2-hour event included an abbreviated version of the documentary, which follows Robinson from her earliest days as a daughter of two medical doctors and sister to three brothers to her time at Dublin's Trinity College and later Harvard, then onto a 20-year tenure in Ireland as senator and becoming the first woman president of Ireland in 1990. Having left the Labour Party in 1985, she won her presidential election as an independent and promoted the legalization of

contraceptives and divorce in the Catholic country but left office before her term was complete to accept a post as High Commissioner of Human Rights under Secretary General Kofi Annan at the UN in 1997, with the landmark Good Friday Agreement for peace in violence-torn Northern Ireland taking place in April 1998.

During the chat, Robinson, 80, told the **CARTER** Center audience the timing of that much-criticized early exit from her role was one of her biggest mistakes.

She also said she is not a fan of seeing herself on film but agreed to participate in Mrs. Robinson because she hopes the footage will encourage women to become more involved with advocacy for their own rights and most pressingly, tackling climate crises via activism such as her latest campaign, Project Dandelion.

"It's so urgent, it really is, and we want to tell a very positive narrative that we're on the cusp of this much healthier, clean energy, renewable energy, and no-waste circular economy as the world," Robinson said. "And think of the difference for developing countries" if renewable energy could provide electricity across the continent of Africa and reduce the need for aid, she added.

Alexander noted the **CARTER** Center's nonpartisan approach to its programs and both women agreed that solutions for the future should involve multiple stakeholders across generation.

But a stack of questions from the audience, read aloud from notecards by moderator Nicole Kruse, primarily sought comment and advice from Robinson about how to move forward in a world where alliances are tenuous and human rights are slipping globally.

"I just want to say, 'Yes, this is a very difficult time,'" Robinson said. "There is no question, and it's a time of big fear in this country and self-censoring and self-restraint elsewhere in the world, as well. It's chilling all over."

Robinson said her memories with the Carters and Tutu are reminders that finding joy with family, friends and colleagues can bring a sense of calm and inspiration in periods of uncertainty, as she recalled President **CARTER**'s punctuality to meetings, his fishing wardrobe and laughter that The Elders shared.

She was reluctant to give specific directives but said humor and optimism are vital to health and recounted one of Tutu's famous quotes.

The career of **JIMMY CARTER**, the U.S. President who died on Dec. 29 at age 100, will be remembered for many things: his peanut-farming background, his speedy rise to political fame and fall after one term, his handling — or mishandling — of the energy crisis and the Iran hostage crisis.

Another achievement, from early in his career, may be less well known, but is just as worthy of remembrance.

The mid-1970s, when **CARTER** became a national public figure, was a time of transition, full of the aftershocks of the progress and devastation that had characterized the previous decade, not least in the arena of the civil rights movement. **CARTER** was a Georgian of many generations, whose farming family's presence in the South predated the United States itself. He had no trouble establishing his Southern credentials, but he also differed from many of his neighbors when it came to integration and other racial issues.

As TIME recounted in a 1976 profile of the then-candidate, his mother, known as "Miss Lillian," was a formidable presence in her four children's lives and encouraged them to have compassion for all people, regardless of race—despite any judgment from neighbors steeped in prejudice.

In 1966, **CARTER**, the oldest of those four children, lost the Georgia gubernatorial primary to a segregationist. Four years later, he managed to win the support of some prominent segregationists in the state by ceding ground to

them: He said that he would allow George Wallace, perhaps the most famous of them all, to speak at the state house if he won. But, after winning the office, **CARTER** made it clear that he hadn't totally abandoned his principles, as TIME recounted in the 1976 story:

"Elected by a landslide vote, **CARTER** appeared to be a changed man in office—leading to accusations that he had misled the voters. In his inaugural address, he proclaimed: "The time for racial discrimination is over. No poor rural white or black person should ever have to bear the additional burden of being deprived of the opportunity of an education, a job or simple justice."
[Segregationist former Governor Lester] Maddox cried foul and started sniping at **CARTER**. He has never stopped. He even pursued **CARTER** to New Hampshire last month to denounce him as "the McGovern of '76" and "the Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde of '76."

Unlike [former governor Carl] Sanders, **CARTER** appointed blacks to posts at every level of state government. (Sanders today concedes: "**CARTER** is far more liberal than I ever was.") He set up a biracial "disorder unit" of various experts to mediate clashes between blacks and whites. Since Georgia did not have federal referees to enforce the Voting Rights Act of 1965, **CARTER** deputized all the high school principals in the state as registrars so that they could sign up voters at school. He overhauled the state prison and mental hospitals, which contained a high proportion of blacks. He set up a system of drug treatment and day care centers.

CARTER appealed to blacks perhaps even more strongly by making certain symbolic gestures. When black legislators had a party in their part of town, they sent a routine invitation to the Governor. Much to their surprise, he showed up, and word spread quickly that the Governor was eating chitlins with the brothers. In the state capitol in 1974, **CARTER** placed a portrait of Martin Luther King Jr. on a wall amid pictures of other Georgia notables, while an integrated audience sang We Shall Overcome. Many blacks who did not vote for **CARTER** swung over to his support. Now his presidential drive is endorsed by men as disparate as Martin Luther King Sr. and Henry Aaron."

Sure enough, in the presidential primaries that year, again and again **CARTER** carried the African American vote. As TIME remarked, "The phenomenon of blacks backing a Southern white reared in the Georgia backwoods is one of the most intriguing aspects of the campaign to date." Though support for **CARTER** was driven by his record of conciliation, which he often couched in spiritual

language, it was also helped by the fact that George Wallace was one of his main opponents.

That choice helped many voters overlook the moments when **CARTER**'s civil rights record could be called into doubt, such as his wavering support for busing to integrate schools. During the presidential campaign, **CARTER** also had to apologize for what he called a "careless" choice of words in defense of his stance in opposition to legislating the integration of neighborhoods. (His discussion of the "purity" of communities called to mind, for many, some of history's worst examples of prejudice.) But as TIME noted when naming him 1976's Man of the Year, his success "destroyed forever the hopes of Alabama's George Wallace of rising to national power—a possibility already dimmed by the bullet of a would-be assassin. By showing that a nonracist Southerner could win a major party nomination, **CARTER** gave new pride to his region and went far to heal ancient wounds."

After his Presidency, following a period of relative seclusion in his Georgia hometown, he returned to public life and brought his ideals with him, devoting his life to bettering the world. In 1989, TIME declared that he "may be the best former President America has ever had"; in 2002, he was awarded a Nobel Peace Prize.

Not that those who followed his career would be surprised. Asked by TIME, shortly before he came into the White House, whether all the work he had to do was an overwhelming prospect, **JIMMY CARTER** showed the same humble dedication that would carry him through the decades that followed: "Yes," he said, "but not so much that I would want someone else to do it."

Even in death, the light of **JIMMY CARTER's** public integrity exposes the public corruption coming from Trump's darkness.

Last month Trump issued an executive order to halt the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act (FCPA) for 6–12 months while his newly appointed attorney general, Pam Bondi, reviews the structure of the act and takes “remedial measures” on past applications of the FCPA.

In 1977, the House of Representatives and the Senate passed the FCPA, and President **JIMMY CARTER** signed it into law. The act’s aim was straightforward: Stop US citizens and companies from bribing foreign governments. It was the first law in the world to penalize severely (up to 20 years imprisonment) bribery of officials in foreign countries.

CARTER, when signing the law, made clear his view that “bribery is ethically repugnant and competitively unnecessary.” Born out of the Watergate investigation, FCPA was a response to the uncovering of hundreds of US businesses and entities bribing foreign governments for personal and corporate

gain.

The law also reflected a growing concern for business morality among evangelicals. It's more than coincidental that 1977 was also the year of publication for *Rich Christians in an Age of Hunger*, Ron Sider's book that sold 400,000 copies and made Christianity Today's list of the hundred most influential 20th-century books on religion.

As someone who has spent the better part of her career working in senior care and getting to know so many of our amazing older citizens and their stories, I was reflecting recently on the life and legacy of former President **JIMMY CARTER** following his death at the age of 100. It was a staggeringly full life that showed exactly the value we are capable of sharing with others in our advancing years.

Unfortunately, my attention was then stolen when I saw social media posts about the 100th day of school, usually taking place early in the year, and how many schools were promoting the 100th day with the theme of "Come Dressed like a 100 year old."

And it will take the work of all of us together to understand why these stereotypes lead to unfair treatment and characterization of our older friends, neighbors and loved ones, and to make a pledge do better. Every one of us.

Think of the life **JIMMY CARTER** lived. One of service, selflessness and gratitude. Building houses for Habitat for Humanity and helping to eradicate disease in Africa well into his 80s and 90s. Let's celebrate that.

Think of the lives people who have made it to 90 or 100 years old have lived. Living for a full century. But there is not really any solving that, at least at this moment, and so we talked about how we deal, and what we owe each other and ourselves, and how we're reckoning with the end of the only political reality that we've known and the fact that whatever comes next is not going to be like what came before. There's some reason for hope in that, and there's some hope in this conversation, too.

"Since 3:00 PM on February 15th, the Pikeville Fire Department has responded heroically, participating in over 50 swift water rescue operations and answering more than 130 emergency calls. ...Their dedication and professionalism in the face of this crisis have undoubtedly saved lives, and we owe them our deepest gratitude."

CARTER said that flooding along the Levisa Fork in Pikeville also impacted "numerous neighborhoods, including nearly every home in the Lake View subdivision near Pikeville Commons."

"Several homes along the road in front of Pikeville High School have also suffered flood damage. Our emergency response teams continue to work

tirelessly to ensure the safety of our residents and assess the full extent of the damage," the statement said.
